Trinitas Health and Hospital Boards Resolve to Name Hospital's Newest Building

Boards Posthumously Honor Andrew H. Campbell, Vice Chairman

Elizabeth, New Jersey The Boards of Trustees of Trinitas Health and Hospital have resolved to name the hospital's newest building which houses the Trinitas Comprehensive Cancer Center in memory of the late Andrew H. Campbell, Vice Chairman, who passed away on April 20, 2007. The recently-constructed 5-story, \$28 million building will now be called the *Andrew H. Campbell Pavilion*.

According to Gary S. Horan, FACHE, President & CEO of Trinitas Hospital, "Andy Campbell served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Elizabeth General Medical Center at a unique moment in time when that hospital was heavily involved in consolidation discussions with St. Elizabeth Hospital." The consolidation of the two Elizabeth-based hospitals resulted in the creation of Trinitas Hospital in January 2000.

Horan added, "His commitment to Trinitas Hospital was unwavering, and was demonstrated in part by his willingness to serve as Chairman of the Board during the years immediately following the consolidation. The resulting level of care that is now being provided to the residents of Elizabeth and Union County has reached new heights as a direct result of his exceptional leadership, courage, wisdom and vision for a better future."

"Andy's business skills and knowledge of the healthcare environment, coupled with his confident, friendly nature and great perseverance, were crucial in helping gain the support of local and state leaders for a consolidated healthcare provider in the City of Elizabeth," Horan stated.

Campbell's work with Trinitas Hospital was recognized by the New Jersey Hospital Association, which honored him with its "Trustee of the Year" Award in 2006.

Born in Elizabeth, he resided in Hillside with his wife, Cynthia, and four children. A graduate of Cornell University who later served in the military, Campbell was a business executive who spent more than 30 years with Eastern Steel Barrel Corporation of Piscataway, New Jersey. His leadership positions with the firm included that of Vice President/Treasurer and General Manager prior to his serving as President from 1967 - 1992.

Campbell used his great energy to make significant contributions to organizations beyond his own, thereby providing many other entities with countless hours of volunteer support.

Fundraising leadership was one of his many attributes that proved key to the success of the Trinitas Health Foundation's "Together For Life" capital campaign, for which he served as Co-Chair. He dedicated time and energy to a number of other causes that reflected his concern for his fellow human beings. Among those organizations were the Pingry School, United Way, Wells College, First National Bank of Central Jersey, and Family & Children's Services.

"Ultimately, Andrew H. Campbell will be remembered for his outgoing and jovial nature, his wonderful sense of humor, his business acumen, and above all, his genuine sense of compassion. Trinitas Hospital was truly blessed by his spirit of commitment and the naming of the newest building on our campus as the *Andrew H. Campbell Pavilion* is an extremely fitting tribute to Andy as a man of great stature in our community," concludes Mr. Horan.
